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Presenter Biographies

Lectures

Peggy Day is the Co-ordinator of the Pedagogical Section in Australia, a class holder and has been a teacher/teacher educator for the past 42 years. She works now to support the freedom of the educational impulse and is the lead Writer of the Australian Steiner Curriculum. She is inspired by the possibilities of serving with initiative a world future that brings all beings towards fulfilment of the creative potential of the cosmos.

Birgith Lugosi is Branch Secretary for the Victoria branch of the Anthroposophical Society, the coordinator of the Eurythmy Section for the School of Spiritual Science in Australia and the founder and director of the Aurora Australis School of Eurythmy in Melbourne.

Philip Quenby has been a member of the Anthroposophical society since 1998. Philip has run a weekly study group for 15 years, gives talks on meditation and other subjects, has several roles on society committees and is a Class Holder of the School of Spiritual Science. Philip is passionate about encouraging people to establish their meditation practice, and teaching about the spiritual hierarchies.

Glenn Rawlinson has been a teacher in Steiner education for many years in the UK. Glenn has also been involved as a lecturer in Steiner Teacher training and public lectures on Steiner education. He enjoys acting/drama and has been part of the Chrysalis Theatre group touring Slovenia & Hungary and a drama group at Steiner House in Sydney.

Lukas Ryan has been a student of spiritual science for many years with special interests in the development of human consciousness through the course of life (Biography Work), esoteric Christianity and also the arts, with a particular interest in painting. Lukas has had a career as a psychologist but now focuses on offering Biography Work for individuals and groups. He lives in Melbourne and is currently completing a course in curative eurythmy.

Helen Vogel has worked with community organisations since 1980 across the fields of health and early childhood education. She has also been involved in several government initiatives in the Northern Rivers area of NSW to build stronger communities. She has been a member of the Anthroposophical Society since 1997 and a Class Holder since 2004. Helen is passionate about supportive, creative communities that recognise each person's inner striving.

Short presentations

Jane Bradshaw is the General Secretary of the Australian Anthroposophical Society. Jane works as a Clinical Nurse Consultant in a large public hospital in Tasmania. She has been studying Spiritual Science for 30 years and is particularly interested in the wisdom of the 'threshold experience'.

Cheryl Nekvapil followed Joan Salter's advice from Rudolf Steiner to meditate on Raphael's Sistine Madonna during pregnancy and birth. Many questions about a divine feminine archetype arose through the experiences she had through such meditations. Also through her work for many years as a child-birth educator and then later, working in schools, the quest continued, and continues today. Cheryl is currently a priest of The Christian Community working in the Melbourne congregation.

Rod Tomlinson grew up in Tasmania, encountering Anthroposophy forty years ago while at the University of Tasmania studying classical and modern European languages. His interests in psychology and community building developed apace with his engagement with Steiner education from that period – initially in Tasmania and then in NSW for 25 years and then again in Tasmania, Western Australia and Victoria. Rod's love for Steiner education combines a dedication to Steiner's original indications and an open and creative interest in how these may find meaningful expression today in our diverse communities.

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Workshops

Annika Andersdotter graduated from the Goetheanum in Creative Speech and Drama in 1973 and has since taught and performed in Europe, US and Australia. Annika is currently the director of the Sunstone Studio for Speech and Drama, active in both Sydney and Melbourne.

Dale Jones is an instrumental music teacher at the Samford Valley Steiner School and Birali Steiner School and has worked in Steiner education for over 15 years. He has worked as an orchestral double bass player with the Melbourne, Tasmanian, and Queensland Symphony Orchestras. His primary passion is music composition.
